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# ACT 605 OF 2021: OVERSIGHT OF RETAIL WATER PROVIDERS

- \* Ark. Code Ann. § 14-234-801 et. seq.
- Rules and Guidance from Department of Agriculture, Natural Resources Division

## **Key Goals**

- Blueprint for water security
- Efficient service
- Fiscal stability

## **Fundamental Requirements**

- Rate studies
- Water provider board training
- Advisory committee



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# RATE STUDIES § 14-234-802

- By July 1, 2024, then every 5 years for providers serving 500 or fewer customers.
- By July 1, 2025, then every 5 years for providers serving 501 to 1,000 customers.
- By July 1, 2026, then every 5 years for providers serving more than 1,000 customers.

# Rates and other revenue dedicated to the support of the provider's water system shall adequately address:

- Operation and maintenance
- Debt service
- Required reserves
- Depreciation
- Future capital expenses
- Preparation of an annual audit or agreed-upon procedures and compilation report
- Other expenses as necessary.

Implement rate increase within I year of the receipt of the rate study. If recommended rates increase the provider's rates by 50% or more from the fiscal year before the rate study was completed, the provider may phase in the rate increase over a 2-year period. 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# MUNICIPAL PROVIDERS § 14-234-804

- Providing water outside city limits?
   Require application by property owner or agreement between municipal provider and property owner.
- Want to require properties to annex?

  Outline prerequisite clearly in application or agreement.

## **Advisory Committee**

- If 20% or more of municipal provider's customers are outside city limits, must create nonvoting advisory committee to the municipal provider board.
- Advisory committee's makeup and duties determined by municipality's governing body.
- 2 customers residing outside city limits shall serve on committee.



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# WATER PROVIDER BOARD TRAINING § 14-234-805

- Within I year of election or appointment, a majority of board members shall receive a minimum of 8 hours of provider training.
- Exempt: Members who have served on the board for 10 years or more.

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# "THE STICK": FISCAL DISTRESS

## A provider found to be in fiscal distress:

- Shall file an improvement plan including specific action to be taken to correct financial, technical, and managerial deficiencies, within 90 days of the finding.
- Shall not receive state financial assistance for water operations until an improvement plan that has been approved by the commission is in place.
- Shall obtain written authorization from the commission to:
  - Incur additional debt;
  - Accept assistance for the refurbishment or replacement of facilities or construction of facilities not within the provider's improvement plan; or
  - Transfer assets to another entity.
