ITEM 6. CPRG

A. Energy and Environment for the Natural State Implementation Grant

The following CPRG activities were completed in December and January.

Green Networks

- Released trail, land restoration, and tree planting funding and provided outreach and technical assistance to prospective applicants
- Evaluated applications
- Worked with EPA to provide contract language and environmental assessment to projects

Transportation Efficiency

- Worked with City of Little Rock to identify vehicles for replacement with EVs
- Central Arkansas Library System (CALS) has installed EV charging stations in 9 total locations
- Provided Quality Assurance training to all streetlight and EV vehicle/charger funding recipients
- Streetlight replacement has begun in Alexander in collaboration with Entergy Arkansas

Building Efficiency

- LIT: 152 of the 710 planned wells have been drilled and grouted
- Board approved funding for City of Ward's building efficiency project. Final contract review is underway.

ENERGY AND ENVIRONMENT INNOVATION FOR THE NATURAL STATE
CLIMATE POLLUTION REDUCTION GRANT
GREEN NETWORK PASS-THROUGH GRANTS

WHEREAS, Metroplan is the lead agency for the Energy and Environment Innovation for the Natural State Implementation Grant through the EPA’s Climate Pollution Reduction Grant (CPRG) Program; and

WHEREAS, this grant includes \$15,500,000 for a pass-through grant program for Central Arkansas municipalities, counties, and nonprofit partners to implement Green Network projects to preserve land, restore land, and plant trees, with an average program cost efficiency goal of \$142 per metric ton of CO2 reduced; and

WHEREAS, round 1 projects were award funding in May 2026 in the amount of \$8,176,000; and

WHEREAS, Metroplan received Round 2 applications from its members on January 9, 2026; and

WHEREAS, projects were evaluated in accordance with program guidelines and at the direction of the Metroplan Board;

Recommendations for funding include all projects in priority 1 and 2. Projects in priorities 3 and 4 are recommended for contingency awards, with these projects being reevaluated in July to ensure they are moving to bidding in 2026. ITEM 9. 2026 PROJECT OBLIGATIONS

SUMMARY

Metroplan staff are preparing an obligation plan with ARDOT for FFY 2026. Projects that have been previously awarded funding and are expected to be obligated are included on the following page.

Metroplan staff estimates \$18.5 million in new federal funding available for 2026 with \$3.451 million carried forward from 2025. Staff anticipate obligations to a new zero balance.
